Start out with a good quality 16 to18% protein ration with at least 12 to15% crude fiber Feed the lambs all of this ration that they will eat until they reach 100 pounds of body weight After they reach 100 pounds, you should feed the black face lambs 1 to 15 pounds of feed 2 times per day All other breeds
